Discussion was had about traffic signals on US 19 for the Flashing versus regular function at night.

Discussion was had on pedestrian crossings and speed enforcement along US 19 due to the flashing signals.

Pasco County is getting preliminary data prepared to submit to their contractor to implement their traffic counts.

Discussion was had about the MPO funding of the system, and additional traffic count information which led to a discussion on roundabouts, with additional commentary on traffic counts and the efficiency factor of self-service web access.

Monica gave a presentation about impaired driving and the correlation between DUI and criminal driving.

Discussion was had about "Intersections"; seven crashes since March.

A bid was received on the Bell Lake Road and Carver Parkway project.

Team asked for FDOT to arrange an RSA within 60-90 days on 7 Springs Blvd, between 54 and Green Branch Road and Rowan Road.
