There is a push to get more middle schools next year. She also shared information about the Community Events they hosted, and upcoming events and how many events they hosted/attended last year.</p> <p>Ridgecrest Elementary lowered speed limits – 15 mph on 119th St, Gooding Crossing.</p> <p>Plumb Elementary – Install no parking signs</p> <p>Palm Harbor Fire - Spoke about booster seats and children stay in the back seat until 13 years old and buckle up signs that will be placed around schools to help educate the public.</p>	Information and ongoing
