



Minutes: Tuesday, February 9th, 2016

December minutes were approved. Harry had a question about the location of the Dollar Store on 41. It was clarified. January minutes were then approved.

OLD

Harry discussed the Towsen Park Crossing. He said that Heba from Hernando County called him and said the removal of the signs had been approved. He reported that the signs had not been removed yet.

Harry also asked about the Silver Lake issue. Steve was not present to address the issue. Harry also reported that the signs on the Good Neighbor Trail situation is ongoing.

Harry also discussed issues related to the Withalacoochee Trail and Independence.

Walt discussed a problem location on Old Floral City Road, north of Orange Avenue. School Zone signs have been updated, a request was made to Citrus County Sherriff about efforts to increase LEO presence.

Pat reported that the stop signs on the roads from Sugarmill Woods along US 98 have been replaced with larger signs. Additional STOP AHEAD signage has also been installed.

NB 41 and WB 486 – there is a request for guide stripes for a left hand turn.

Michael discussed Gulf to Lake to 44 to Cherry Ave resurfacing.

NEW

Montgomery Ave – NB approaching 44, right lane becomes a right turn only lane. A request was made for signage to alert motorists – advance warning sign, this location may possibly fall within the Inverness City Limits.

Harry has requested a flow chart for follow up on the various requests and projects. He has concerns about projects falling off the radar. A project Status Chart.

DEP has now allowed motorized use on the Withalacoochee Trail. Discussion was had, concerns about motorized bikes that don't appear to be motorized.
